Light of Christ Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - Tuesday, March 19th, 2024

These minutes are abbreviated. If you would like the full minutes, ask a council member.

The meeting was called to order by President, Dwight E. A prayer was said by Pastor Kevin.

The following members were in attendance: Dwight E, Kelly K, Gary H, Matt H, Wendy J, Kayla F, and Bev Q.

A motion to accept the previous meetings minutes. Motion passed.

<u>Pastor's report</u>: Pastor Beard advised that worship is going well. There are four (4) students in Confirmation. Bible studies are going well, but there will be none during lent. The Easter Festival is being well planned and Pastor thanks those that are doing it. New council members will need to be installed.

Treasurers report: Kelly advised that he got the last backup of the numbers from Erin O, and that she is now done with bookkeeping. The new bookkeeping service, Quality bookkeeping, will take over on the 21st. Kelly advised that he has internalized church giving with the Church 360 program that Pastor Beard is already using. The reports that are provided to the council during meetings have been simplified and put into similar categories by Kelly. The January/February income was \$37,790.91, this was above what had was previously budgeted (more made). Most categories have spent less than was previously budgeted. There is currently \$135,790.91 in total checking/savings. Kelly advised that in the future if additional CD's are done, he would look into dispersing this to another bank, as there was up to \$250,000 in insurance per Tax ID at each bank. Approved.

Old business:

<u>Stephen Ministry update</u>: Pastor Beard advised that they would start training for this in the middle of April, with interviews upcoming and that they are ready to go. Pastor Beard and Renee Ginther are the Stephen Leaders. There will be 50 hours of training/classes.

<u>Daycare</u>: Pastor Beard advised that he was sent a note about people not blocking driveways in the area when people are picking up their children. Amy Giordano advises that she is doing well, and has a good crew after having hiring issues.

New business:

<u>Banking</u>: A motion to combine the two separate LOC and Mission building accounts into one account was made by Kelly and seconded by Bev. Motion passed.

<u>Insurance</u>: The coverage for the church was upped to \$2.44 million for the building. Personal property is at \$200,000. It is possible that the coverage for personal property being upped in the new year. Currently \$8,845.00 has been paid for this year's policy cost.

<u>Altar update</u>: Rick Tofte was contacted about the update to the altar and when a good time to start would be. According to Rick, this could be in the fall. The approximate time for this project could be around 3 weeks. A committee to look into building materials and costs would need to be formed.

Church candles: A motion to have Pastor Beard order a new set of candles for the altar. Passed.

<u>Upper Missouri Ministries</u>: Pastor Beard advised that he is now on the board of Upper Missouri Ministries due to several members leaving. The camp is being renamed and is now called Springbrook Bible Camp which will have a new website and new director.

A motion to adjourn this meeting was made by Kelly and seconded by Matt. Motion passed. The meeting was concluded with the Lord's Prayer.

The next council meeting will be May 14th, 2024 with meal provided by Wendy.

LUTHERAN HOUR MINISTRIES

DEVOTION from LHM.ORG

Acts 2:42-47 - And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.



And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

People are often looking for the Holy Spirit in extraordinary things, like miracles, exorcisms, healings, and other great spiritual experiences. In the book of Acts, such great deeds of the Spirit are indeed present, especially among the apostles, but their role is penultimate or secondary in the broader story of God's salvation. Their role is ultimately to draw attention to the preaching of the Word of God, which by the power of the Holy Spirit, brings sinners to faith in Christ and Baptism in His Name. As the apostle Peter reminds us, the Holy Spirit's great manifestation on Pentecost was meant to call attention to God's ordinary ways to bestow the same Holy Spirit on people of all nations, namely, through God's Word and the Sacrament of Baptism. He says, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the Name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to Himself" (Acts 2:38b-39).

In the days of the reformer Martin Luther, many people thought of pilgrimages to shrines of virgins or saints as a means to becoming more spiritual. Instead of placing their hope in such extraordinary experiences, Luther advised the people to start looking for the Holy Spirit in ordinary things, to look for the Spirit in the ordinary ways in which God works for and among His people. In a treatise titled, "An Open Letter to the Christian Nobility," Luther advised: "Let every man stay in his own parish. There he will find more than in all the shrines. In your own parish you will find Baptism, the Sacraments, preaching, and your neighbor."

In Acts 2:42-47, Luke gives us a way to look for the Holy Spirit in those ordinary things through which God reliably works to draw us to Himself and to one another. The enduring fruit and lasting miracle of Pentecost in our lives is the fellowship of the Holy Spirit we share with one another in the church. Where then is the Holy Spirit? Where people gather around the apostolic Word of God, break bread together, pray for one another, there is the Holy Spirit. Where people worship together, share gifts and burdens with one another, there is the Spirit. Where people show generosity towards the needy, support the work of mission, and bear witness to Christ in word and deed, that's where the Holy Spirit works every day to bind us in fellowship with Christ and each other.

WE PRAY: Holy Spirit, help us to be thankful for the ordinary ways You work in our lives. Amen.
