## THE UPPER ROOM®



My wife and I sat in our sunroom and watched a storm rage outside. As we watched the rain pour down and heard the thunder rumble, we noticed a purple martin flying through the wind and rain. She flew up to her nest under the eaves at the corner of our house. We could hear the chirping of her babies as she brought them a tiny insect, and then with a chirp of her own, she took off to find more for them to eat. Time after time she returned and then took off again. The heavy rain and strong wind occasionally blew her off course, but she never stopped. Our admiration for her grew with each trip she made, and we both remarked that there was something inspirational about her behavior.

Long after the storm ended, I kept thinking about what we had witnessed. The mother bird's behavior made me think of the sacrifice that Jesus made for all of us. Like the purple martin, his sacrifice was an act of intense love! The little bird's determined care for her young reminded us that God really does care about and provide for all of creation. God's love will endure and will not be turned aside by the storms of adversity. I pray that the devotion of the little bird will stay alive in my memory and inspire me to show love to others and to trust God to provide for God's children.

#### Light of Christ Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - Tuesday, January 9<sup>th</sup>, 2024

These minutes are abbreviated. If you would like the full minutes, ask a council member.

The meeting was called to order by President, Dwight E.

A prayer prior to the meal was said by President, Dwight E.

The following members were in attendance: Dwight E, Rick T, Gary H, Matt H, Wendy J, Kayla F, and Bev Q.

A motion to accept the previous meetings minutes was made by Kayla and was seconded by Rick. Motion passed.

Treasurers report: Rick went over the financial report. 2023 year end the church has \$309,755.89 in savings/checking.

Rick advised that he would be putting \$200,000 in the CD as discussed in the next week or so.

The benevolences went out in November in the amount of \$24,613.00.

Gary made a motion to accept the treasurers report which was seconded by Bev. Motion passed.

**Old business:** There was no old business discussed.

#### New business:

**Daycare lease:** The lease was lowered to \$3,000 a month from February 2023 to January 2024. A motion was made by Rick to keep the payment at this same amount until January 2025. This was seconded by Wendy. Motion passed.

**Treasurer:** Rick's daughter, Erin O, has been assisting Rick with the bookkeeping but is getting busy with her job and won't be able to continue assisting the treasurer. Rick advised that Kelly K. has shown interest in being on the church council. Kelly has approximately 40 years of experience as a CPA and also has experience in church. Rick mentioned talking with

Klem about the possibility of being on the council in the treasurer's position.

Rick mentioned there might be a need to purchase Quick Books to assist with the treasurer's position as well as possibly hiring another firm to help with accounting and payroll. Possibly Lee Suess?

Proposed budget: The office supplies budget for 2024 may need to be upped if Quick Books needs to be purchased. \$1,950 for discretionary funds will go to the Salvation Army for assisting people in the community on the church's behalf.

Salary: The \$6,000 voted on a raise in salary for Pastor Beard during the last meeting is being amended to \$3,000. This will be split into insurance and retirement at Pastor Beard's input.

Bookkeeping: This has been increased due to the possibility of adding the expense of outside accounting/Quick Books purchase.

A motion to approve the proposed budget was made by Gary and seconded by Kayla. Motion passed.

Annual meeting: The annual meeting will be on January 28th with a potluck to follow. Reports for the annual meeting need to be into Pastor Beard by Sunday, January 14th in order to give Pastor Beard time before the meeting to get things out to the congregation.

Appreciation: A motion to give Pastor Beard \$200 for pastor appreciation month along with \$250 to Luanne and \$100 to Laura Bearce for all that they do throughout the year was made by Bev and seconded by Gary. The motion passed.

The next council meeting will be March 12th, 2024 with meal provided by Matt.

## DEVOTION from LHM.ORG

Psalm 147:4-6 - He determines the number of the stars; He gives to all of them their names. Great is our Lord, and abundant in power; His understanding is beyond measure. The LORD lifts up the humble; He casts the wicked to the ground.

One estimate suggests that there are one septillion stars in the universe. That is a one followed by 24 zeroes. In other words, there are a lot of stars. We give names to some stars, like Sirius or Antares. Astronomers document other stars with letters and numbers, but these are human designations and estimates. God, whose "understanding is beyond measure," created every one of those stars. He "determines the number of the stars; He gives to all of them their names."

Our gracious, all-knowing God pays close attention to details, including numbers and names, and not just for the stars. Scripture sometimes mentions a few of those interesting details and numbers. In those days, five sparrows were sold for two pennies. God does not forget even those little birds, but we are worth so much more to Him than sparrows. He knows the number of hairs on our heads (see

Luke 12:6-7). After Jesus' resurrection, Peter and some of the other disciples went fishing and hauled in a net "full of large fish, 153 of them" (John 21:11b). On Pentecost "about three thousand souls" were baptized and added to the church (Acts 2:41b).

God counts souls and stars, fish and sparrows—and sheep. In one of Jesus' parables, a shepherd leaves 99 sheep to find one lost sheep. The story is about Jesus Himself, who came to seek and to save the lost. Names and numbers fill the story of our salvation. Guided by one special star, wise men found the Holy Child named Jesus in Bethlehem. Years later, three crosses were set up at a place called Golgotha. On the center cross Jesus suffered and died to save the lost, to save us all! Then, on the third day after His death, the early light of dawn revealed one empty tomb. Jesus has risen from the dead! On the Last Day when He returns, "all who are in the tombs will hear His voice" (John 5:28b), and through faith in His Name, we will rise to live in His presence forever.

In Baptism, God adopts us as His sons and daughters. The Lord who gives names to the stars names us as His own: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are Mine" (Isaiah 43:1b). One day we will stand before the throne of God in "a great multitude that no one could number" as we cry out in praise to our God and Savior, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" (Revelation 7:9b, 10b). We may not be able to number that multitude, but God can, and He knows every name.
