Council Meeting Minutes Tuesday, September 20, 2022 These minutes are abbreviated. If you would like the full minutes, ask a council member.

The meeting was called to order by President Dwight Ebel. Rick made a motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting, Kim seconded, motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor has one confirmation student this year. Worship is going well. Sunday School and Bible Blocks are also going well. Bible studies continue to have about four to seven participants attending. There is a Pastor's conference coming up in St. Paul, MN. October 24-27.

The church service on Sunday, November 20, 2022 will be a Polka service with the Jore family. Rumor has it there will be a couple of banjo players also.

Treasurer's Report: Rick went over the financial report. The disbursements for the roof and for the kitchen remodel have not yet been completely paid out. We are still waiting for the door frames to arrive. Roger motioned to accept the report, Bev seconded, motion carried.

Old Business: Rick and Pastor Kevin have continued to work on a retirement plan for Pastors of LOCLC. They have been working with Thrivent insurance. Thrivent has also suggested a 403b plan document for the church, which would cover additional employees of the church, if hired. Cost of this document would run \$1000. Dianne made a motion to do this, Kim seconded, motion carried.

Our building insurance has gone up from \$6,183. to \$7,225. We have a \$2,500. deductible. Coverage went from 1.7 million to 1.9 million on our building. Roger moved, Matt seconded and motion carried.

On building updates; the roofing is done, waiting on kitchen door frames, PA booth set up next week.

Fall cleaning: Bev will call Plains Window Cleaning to set up indoor/ outdoor window cleaning. Kim will talk to the volleyball team about scrubbing our fellowship hall tables and chairs. **New Business:** Lent begins March 1, 2023. There will be no Bible study during lent as there is a time conflict with our Lenten services being on the same evenings.

A question was asked as to why LOC doesn't pay their organists, as most other churches do. A general discussion among the council members showed they would be in favor of doing this.

Someone suggested that our church vacuum was not the best and we should look into a new one. Discussion. Decide to maintain the filters and see if current equipment will suffice.

Light of Christ has been contacted by the AALC, to help support Abiding Grace Lutheran, in Gillette, WY. They need a Pastor and help financially to call one. It was suggested a commitment of 2 or more AALC suggested a possible amount of \$5,000 to \$10,000 a year from each donating church. The council decided to make a one time gift of \$5,000. to help this church. After a year we will revisit.

Pastor Kevin has been interested in getting a Stephen's Ministry started at LOC. He has been talking to members and has found someone willing to be a leader as well as members willing to be ministers. A motion was made by Bev and seconded by Kim to move forward with this ministry. Motion carried. Pastor Kevin was going to contact the ministry administration to get the exact costs that would be required for training, etc.

Pastor Kevin was asked to consider having LOCLC as a OCC Shoebox drop off point. (Samaritan's Purse Christmas boxes) The drop off dates would be November 14-21. We would set our receiving hours as 4-7 PM on each of those days. Dianne moved, Bev seconded and motion carried.

One request for use of the fellowship hall on May 26, 2023 for a graduation event.

Our congregational soup and chili cook-off will be held on Sunday, October 30th, 2022, at 5 PM. The coveted traveling trophy will again be up for grabs!!

Habakkuk 1 & 2 The oracle that Habakkuk the prophet saw. O LORD, how long shall I cry for help, and You will not hear? Or cry to You "Violence!" and You will not save? Why do You make me see iniguity, and



why do You idly look at wrong? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. So the law is paralyzed, and justice never goes forth. For the wicked surround the righteous; so justice goes forth perverted. ... I will take my stand at my watchpost and station myself on the tower, and look out to see what He will say to me, and what I will answer concerning my complaint. And the LORD answered me: "Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so he may run who reads it. For still the vision awaits its appointed time; it hastens to the end-it will not lie. If it seems slow, wait for it; it will surely come; it will not delay. Behold, his soul is puffed up; it is not upright within him, but the righteous shall live by his faith."

The prophet Habakkuk says exactly the kinds of things I would like to say to God. He's upset with God; he sees that the world around him is filled with violence and evil, and he wants to know why God isn't doing anything. Habakkuk has been praying and crying out to God for help, but it looks like nothing's happening. Evil is winning, and God is silent.

Faced with that situation, many people lose their faith. But Habakkuk does something different. He's going to set himself up like a man on a watchtower and look out toward the horizon, to see if God's answer is on the way. Deep down inside, angry or not, Habakkuk still trusts that God is going to going to hear him. And God does hear him! An answer is coming—an answer to all this evil. It may seem slow, but God is sending help. And in



the meantime, Habakkuk will be waiting and trusting.

What answer did God send? He sent an answer nobody could have predicted—He came Himself, as a tiny human baby, born into our world to save us. Who could expect such a weak person to win the war against evil? And yet He did—not the way we might have expected, through force, but instead through His own suffering, death, and resurrection. The writer of Hebrews explains why Jesus took on our flesh and blood: "that through death He might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery" (Hebrews 2:14b-15).

Now, when we grieve over the violence and evil in our world, we have this comfort—that God has seen our distress and has answered us. The evils of this world will have a complete end when Jesus returns in glory. He has already won the war. And so we wait for Him with hope and trust.

WE PRAY: Dear Lord, come quickly and bring us Your peace, blessing, and goodness. Amen.
