Liturgy includes the standard texts (e.g., the Kyrie, Creed, Sanctus, Agnus Dei, etc.) that have been handed down over the centuries. The liturgy provides a consistency to worship. One of the most important aspects of liturgical worship is repetition. Through weekly repetition of basic, Gospel-centered texts from Holy Scripture, we learn the fundamental teachings of the Christian faith. The liturgy and hymns serve as building blocks for a lifetime of receiving God's gifts through Word and Sacrament.

### **Introduction to our worship...**

- Is to receive God's gifts - His Word and holy Sacraments;
- Is Christ centered;
- Is a reflection of Lutheran theology;
- Is characterized by reverence and dignity;
- Seeks to edify Christ's holy people.



*And at the end of eight days, when He was circumcised, He was called Jesus, the Name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb. (Luke 2:21)*

When Jesus was eight days old, it was time for Him to be named and circumcised. Every Jewish boy was circumcised as God commanded Abraham, to mark Him as someone who belonged to God and who lived under God's Law.

Circumcision was a ceremony that happened at home, though we don't know where Jesus and His parents were living at this point. I hope Joseph had found them somewhere more comfortable to stay—a house, perhaps, or even just a guest room with a relative! Certainly he was doing his best to keep both mother and Child well and happy.

But neither Joseph nor Mary could spare Jesus the pain that came with circumcision. This was God's command, and it had to be done—even to God-in-the-flesh Himself, Jesus our Savior. And so Jesus felt His first pain since birth, and shed His first blood. What a welcome to the Savior who would save His people through a painful, bloody death!

But if circumcision reminds us of pain, it also reminds us that Jesus has joined Himself to us and all God's people forever. He is on our side—the human side—and He bears the marks of it in His own body. Even now that He has risen from the dead, He continues to be ours, one of us. And where He goes we go—because Jesus has made us His own forever.

**WE PRAY:** Dear Jesus, thank You for accepting pain for me and joining Yourself to us forever. Amen.

**Reflection Questions:**



- Were you baptized as an infant?

**Council Meeting Minutes - Tuesday, Nov 18<sup>th</sup>, 2025**

These minutes are abbreviated. If you would like the full minutes, ask a council member.

The meeting was called to order by President, Dwight Ebel. Prayer was said by Pastor Kevin.

The following members were in attendance: Dwight Ebel, Kelly Klem, Matt Haugen, Wendy Johnson, Kayla Fenster, Amber Park and Pastor Kevin Beard.

A motion to accept the previous meetings minutes was made. Approved.

**Pastor's report:** Pastor Beard advised that confirmation has started for the year and that he is having a real good time and that the kids are well behaved and that he has changed the curriculum. Bible study is well attended. Operation Christmas Child is ongoing and the church is a drop off for it again. Pastor advised that services and communion are going well and that he is enjoying them.

**Treasurers report:** Kelly advised that currently there is \$11,364.94 in checking with \$20,037.58 in savings. There was an additional \$100,000 added to the church's CD's this year. \$200,000 in CD's were recently renewed at rates around 3.5% versus the rates for last year which were closer to 4%. All expenses are inline. There was \$99,056 in construction in 2025 for the church. This was between the altar renovation and basement/daycare issues. Giving was down as well as royalty income due to oil prices being down. Building costs are up due to insurance as well as additional roof policy being purchased. There was a net income of \$7,300 for September to October, this was less than what was budgeted. The Church is ahead of expenses by \$39,000 year to date and about \$5,000 behind what was budgeted, but still in good shape.

A motion for an honorarium of \$600 for Luane and \$150 for Laura for being the church pianists for the year was made. Approved.

In 2025, \$23,944 is going out for charitable giving. \$8,450 still has to be paid out. \$26,000 was budgeted for. Motion passed.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

**2026 Budget:** The congregational annual giving amount estimate for 2026 was reduced from \$144,000 to \$135,000 reflecting lower giving amounts by the congregation in the current year (2025). Kelly advised that he adjusted the amounts given to some benevolences and added YNOP Radio. This is a change from the previous tentative 2026 budget. The property and liability insurance was increased in the budget due to the higher insurance as well. Motion passed.

**Sanctuary Christmas trees:** Two new "skinny" Christmas trees were purchased, one by the church, and one by the Women of Life with a cost of approximately \$180 per tree. The new trees will be lit once they are up and after Thanksgiving during December Women of Life meeting.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

**Marriages/funerals** in the church: Pastor Beard would like to add to the church bylaws about the Light of Christ pastor being the officiant for anything done in the church including funerals and weddings of non-members. Pastor Beard will type something up and get it to the congregation prior to the annual meeting.

**Confirmation pictures:** Pastor Beard ordered new 8x10 frames for the photos of the confirmation classes. This will keep all the photos the same and get them up to date.

**Sanctuary lighting issue:** Larger "flood lights" are causing issues at the front of the sanctuary. These lights will be replaced and an anonymous member of the congregation has advised that they will take care of the bill.

**Annual meeting:** The Light of Christ annual meeting will be held on January 25th , 2026. The deadline for reports will be January 5th.

The meeting was concluded with the Lord's Prayer.

The next council meeting will be January 13th, 2026 with meal provided Dwight.
