Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" - Exodus 3:11 (NRSVUE)

Moses is one of the most important figures in history. However, he spent most of his life in anonymity. After living the early part of his life among the Egyptian aristocracy, he became a shepherd and was quite old when God called him to a great mission.

God spoke to Moses through a magnificent revelation of power: a bush that burned with fire and was not consumed. However, Moses responded to God's call with a question: "Who am I that I should go?" Moses' question makes sense. After all, he was a murderer and a fugitive (see Ex. 2:11-15). When Moses made excuses based on his incapacity, God refuted them saying, "I will be with you."

Many times in my life I have had to face circumstances that seemed beyond my capabilities. Better candidates always came to mind — people who could fulfill a divine mission more excellently. But the heavenly answer is always the same: "I will be with you." Then I understand: it is not about who I am but about the Holy One who calls me.

Dear God, thank you for being with us. Help us to trust you when you call us to do something we feel unprepared for. Amen.

LUTHERAN HOUR MINISTRIES

DEVOTION from LHM.ORG

John 4:9-10 - The Samaritan woman said to Him [Jesus], "How is it that You, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?" (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.) Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water."

This devotion pairs with this weekend's Lutheran Hour sermon, which can be found at lhm.org.

Almost without exception, Jews and Samaritans hated each other. To the Jews, the Samaritans were half-breeds and bad sports. They claimed kinship with the Jews when it served them but distanced themselves when it didn't. To the Samaritans, the Jews were pompous hypocrites who added books to the Bible (the Samaritan Bible had only five books, the first five written by Moses). And by the time that God's Son Jesus was born among us, the conflict between these two groups had reached a feverish pitch.

One source of contention was that Jewish neighborhoods were divided between north and south, and the Samaritans were in the middle. So, the Jews had to travel through Samaria regularly. Three times a year, Jews in the north had to travel south to Jerusalem for their holy days. According to the Jewish historian Josephus, many Jews, rather than going around, took the direct route through Samaria. Eventually, some Samaritans got fed up with these trespassing Jews. So, they ambushed their camp, raided their tents, murdered their people.

The northern Jews appealed to the Roman governor for revenge, but the Samaritans bribed him, convinced him to stay out of it. So, the Jews took matters into their own hands. They raided and burned Samaritan villages. Then the Roman emperor got involved. Several Jews got crucified. Samaritans were slain. And one of the ringleaders was drug through the streets and slaughtered in the town square (see Josephus, *Antiquities*, 20.6).

So Jesus, like other northern Jews of His day, traveled through Samaria on His way to Jerusalem. But on this trip, Jesus takes a risk (humanly speaking). He doesn't just pass through, but He stops in Samaria, exposes Himself and His followers to grave danger, lingers at a well. It was a famous well dug over a thousand years ago by the Jewish patriarch Jacob—Jacob who'd received the promise of God that through his family all the families of the earth would be blessed—all of them. Jews. Samaritans, Gentiles, you, me, everyone. All would be blessed with new life through the Messiah, who would come from Jacob's descendants so that He could die and rise and rule and return one day, to guench a thirsty world and make us one. That's why Jesus strikes up a conversation with this woman and invites her to put all her trust in Him, which she does, and immediately joins Him in His unifying mission.

Jesus is doing the same for you today. He invites you into His life so that together we can cross borders, build bridges with people who are different from us, to do the things that make for unity, to participate with people from every tribe, language, and nation in a bigger mission, for a bigger harvest, to the praise of a bigger God, who will take all of us, no exceptions.

WE PRAY: Dear Jesus, even if our divisions remain for a time, make them smaller in the light of Your expansive love. Amen.

Council Meeting Minutes - Tuesday, January 14th, 2025

These minutes are abbreviated. If you would like the full minutes, ask a council member.

The meeting was called to order by President, Dwight Ebel. A prayer was said for our meal.

The following members were in attendance: Dwight Ebel, Kelly Klem, Gary Hansen, Matt Haugen, Wendy Johnson, Kayla Fenster, Bev Quale and Pastor Kevin Berd.

<u>Pastor's report:</u> Pastor Beard reports that everything is going well. There have been lots of funerals this year, 11 funerals and 4 weddings. Greg Stenzel will be the new pastor for Our Redeemers. Worship is going well and Pastor Beard is very happy with how confirmation is going this year. Sunday school and bible study are also going well. Pastor Beard is doing his best.

Treasurers report: Kelly has completed the corporate registration, tax abatement and W2 balance for the church with the 10-99's soon to follow. There are \$80,000 more in assets than last year. There are \$300,000 in CD's vs the previous \$200,000. \$200,000 is at ASB with \$100,000 at First State. Overall income is slightly over budget with slightly less received in collections (\$8,000 less). Royalties received was \$3,000 which is less. Benevolences went out in Dec to the amount of \$8,400. There were less in ministry expenses than budgeted. Admin costs were less and building maintenance costs were down. Nov to Dec collections were up. So far, we are \$29,000 ahead ytd in the budget. The expenses are in line and less than planned. 2023 to 2024 expenses are similar and in line.

Old business: Sanctuary altar remodel update: Rick is working on getting brick samples. Around \$40,000 to \$45,000 for the building, brick, frame for the cross, panels, tape/ texture, data and led lights. This does not include the stained glass which Pastor Beard advised that he would do with the help of the congregation. Timeline for the project could start

around the end of March with a possible completion of around Easter. Pastor Beard to order the stained glass necessary.

Door stops: Matt is still looking into these with no update from last meeting.

Daycare lease: The daycare lease has been signed and that this is the same 3-year lease as the last lease at \$3,000 a month with an option to add another 3 years on the form. If a new 3-year lease is signed after this 3 year, the rent will be upped to \$3,300 a month.

Pastor retirement program: Kelly got Pastor Beard all set with AALC and he is good to go.

Final budget: Per Kelly, there is not going to be a lot of differences on the final budget than what had been previously brought to the council.

Parking lot: Gary will be getting quotes to fix the East corner of the building to the end of the asphalt on the West end of the parking lot in the coming spring/summer.

New Business:

Annual Meeting: Pastor Beard has texted those who need to submit reports as he is working on getting things ready to go prior to the annual meeting. Pastor Beard and Council President Dwight Ebel will be working on the agenda for the annual meeting.

Council members: Church council Secretary Matt Haugen and Vice President Bev Quale's terms on the council will be coming up. Matt has advised that he would like to remain on the council for another term as secretary and Bev advised that she would like to step down. Kayla Fenster informed the council that she would be interested in becoming Vice President and Amber Park advised that she would be interested in being on the council.

The Light of Christ Church Council would like to thank Bev Quale for all that she has done for our church and congregation and thanks her for her years of service to Mission Lutheran, Light of Christ and its members. You will be missed!

The meeting was concluded with the Lord's Prayer.

The next council meeting will be March 11th, 2025 with meal provided by Gary Hansen.
